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How it works (same set-up as last year):

Everyone will have beads to signify their offering:

- ❖Yellow = Internship
- ❖Green = Full-Time Job
- Purple = Just here for the food and good conversation!

Yes, you can wear both Yellow & Green.

Students have the same corresponding beads



Employer Check-In Table

A digital pin will be dropped on the live board with your company name.

- Each person recruiting may represent ONE location on the map.
- You can talk about as many locations as you'd like!



Pop-Up Corners

After settling in, a new set of 'corners' will be swapped every 20-30 minutes

- Encourages movement
- Assists with finding specialized positions and locations

- Look for the bead colors that match your needs!
- The students can be intimidated to talk to you!
 - Yell out to them!
 - Call them over to talk!



KEEPING THE CONVERSATION GOING

- Ask what they are looking for in an internship or career
- Explain what the job could entail
- Ask what they like to do for fun be genuine!

SELL THE MECHANICAL INDUSTRY

- This is the easy part!
- Tell them something unique or different about your company



THERE ARE LOTS OF STUDENTS TO TALK TO

- Exit the conversation in a positive way
- Trade contact info via the digital business card to connect more later

BE RESPECTFUL OF THEIR TIME TOO



Some DOs

- DO be inviting, energetic and lively
- Give honest sincere appreciation
- Ask questions that allow them to elaborate
- Let them do the talking
- Be a good listener
- If you aren't a good fit, help connect them with someone who is!



DON'T

- Don't congregate with other contractors or colleagues
- Don't ask yes or no questions
- Don't interrupt allow the other person to finish their thoughts
- Steer clear of divisive and polarizing subjects, such as politics and religion
- Steer clear of using offensive or derogatory language
- Steer clear of jokes that could be considered offensive
